

Services Development Nutritional (NDS) celebrated National School Lunch Week which took place October 9-13, 2023. The fun and creative campaign theme, "Level Up with highlighted the Lunch," School importance of a healthy school lunch to student success in and out of the classroom.

"Recent research shows that many children are getting their healthiest meals at school. National School Lunch Week highlights the benefits of the meals available daily," said Lizanne F. Hagedorn, Executive Director of NDS.

The National School Lunch Program (NSLP) offers students fruits, vegetables, whole grains, lean protein, and milk as part of every lunch. Evolving federal nutrition standards ensure that these meals are age appropriate for calorie levels while limiting both unhealthy fats and sodium. The program plays an important role in improving children's diets and combatting food insecurity.

Hagedorn added that National School Lunch Week is an opportunity to learn more about this service and to thank school staff and volunteers who prepare and serve meals to students each school day.

In addition to celebrating National School Lunch Week, NDS hosted a "Placemat & Slogan Contest" for students grades K-12 who are recipients of their School Meal Program. The annual competition employs student-made artwork to debut on NDS breakfast and lunch tray liners.

Each participant was asked to hand draw in black or dark ink an original artwork that encourages healthy eating and physical activity.

Winners of the three age categories hailed from Blessed Trinity Regional Catholic School, Nazareth Academy Grade School, and Christopher Columbus Charter School. In addition to having their designs printed on breakfast and lunch tray liners, winners also received a \$50 gift certificate.














Martha's Choice Awarded Over \$20,000 through the GIANT Company's "Make a Difference Challenge"



Are you a citizen of Haiti interested in filing for asylum in the United States but aren't sure where to start? This clinic is for you.

Date: Thursday, November 16th, 2023 Time: 9:30 AM - 11:30 AM

Cost: Free

Immigration attorneys and DOJ accredited representatives will walk you through the asylum application process. Clinic will be conducted in English with Haitian-Creole interpretation.




Boot Up Philly!
